THE RACE OF LIFE

Our hope is to encourage you to be intentional as you, too, seek to be a Jesus Follower who successfully passes the Baton to the next generation.

ABOUT THE STUDY

This study guide is to be used with the video-based course, *Jesus Followers: Real-Life Lessons for Igniting Faith in the Next Generation.* As an integral part of the course, it provides a format for Bible study that serves as the basis for both small-group use (Sunday school classes, women's or men's groups, home or neighborhood studies, one-on-one discipleship) and individual use. This guide will lead you through a series of questions that will enable you to not only discover for yourself the eternal truths revealed by God in the Bible, but also to hear God speaking personally to you through His Word. You then will be prepared to participate in a meaningful time of study and discussion with members of your small group.

PERSONAL STUDY

For each session you will work through five selected passages of Scripture using the 3-Question Study strategy you will learn during the workshop in Session 1. Before you meet with your group, be sure to take the time to reflect and record your personal *Live* in Obedient Response to God's Word statements to share with your group so they can encourage you and hold you accountable.

You will review the lessons, personal applications, and take-aways at your group meeting before you watch the video from Anne and Rachel-Ruth. After each video teaching, there will be group discussion time to learn from one another and share in the experience of how to ignite faith in the next generation.

It is important to complete each personal Bible study before your next session, as this will make the video presentation more meaningful to you during the small-group time. Note that meaningful, daily Bible study will occur if you:

- Set aside a regular place for private devotions.
- Set aside a regular time for private devotions.
- Pray before beginning the day's assignment, asking God to speak to you through His Word.
- Write out your answers for each step, in sequence.
- Make the time to be still and listen, reflecting thoughtfully on your response in the final step.
- Don't rush—it may take time in prayerful meditation on a given passage to discover meaningful lessons and hear the Spirit's whispers.

Spiritual discipline is an essential part of your ability to grow in your relationship with God through knowledge and understanding of His Word. So, take your personal study seriously and allow God to speak to you from His Word. Hearing His voice is thrilling and will make the Bible come alive to you, so get ready to receive blessing after blessing!

GROUP STUDY

In Session 1 of *Jesus Followers*, you will watch the video workshop and be introduced to the 3-Question Study method used in Sessions 2 through 5 personal Bible study. You will be given some time to share insights from your personal Bible study before you and your group watch the video teaching. Space is provided for you to take notes during the video presentation. After the message, you will then have time to discuss the key concepts with your small group using the questions in this guide.

Note: If you are the facilitator for the group, there are additional instructions and resources provided in the facilitator's guide at the back of this book. This guide will help you structure your meeting time, facilitate discussion times, and help lead group members through the key points of the study.

VIDEO SESSION ACCESS

Streaming video access is included with this study guide. There is a streaming video access code and instructions on how to access all of the video sessions on the inside front cover of this study guide.

Simply go to **studygateway.com/redeem** to set up your account and enter your access code to add this study to your new Bible study library. Each time you wish to view a video, simply log in to **studygateway.com/login** and click on the session or study you wish to view. All of your HarperChristian Resources Bible studies with streaming access will be added to your library as you do more studies and redeem the appropriate codes.

INDIVIDUAL COMMITMENT

Remember that the real growth in this study will happen during your quiet times with God. During the group times, you will have the opportunity to process what you have learned with the other members, ask questions, and learn from them as you listen to what God is doing in their lives. In addition, keep in mind that the videos, discussions, and activities in this study are simply meant to tune your heart and your spiritual ears to God's voice so that you can live out what He says as you grow closer to Him.

BIBLE STUDY WORKSHOP

This bible study workshop has a single purpose: to present an approach that will help you learn to listen for God's voice, to grow in your personal relationship with Him, and to have more effective communication with Him through His Word. The following information is introduced in detail in the video presentation. Use this section of the study guide as you view the workshop material. Underline key thoughts and take additional notes as you participate in the workshop. (Note that the passages Anne and Rachel-Ruth use as examples in the video workshop are found on pages 4 and 6.)

WATCH VIDEO SESSION 1—BIBLE STUDY WORKSHOP (46 MINUTES)

Watch video streaming or on DVD.

Anne and Rachel-Ruth will use this video session to walk you through the following five steps to Bible study with the three questions that are essential to the Bible Study Workshop. They will illustrate how to do this Bible study with **Genesis 17:7**. (See pages 4–5 in your study guide.)

STEPS TO BIBLE STUDY

STEP 1: READ GOD'S WORD. (LOOK AT THE PASSAGE.)

The first step is to read the Bible. At the start of each session in this study guide, you will find the Scriptures listed in a column that you should read during the week. When you have finished reading the passage for the day, move on to Step 2.

STEP 2: WHAT DOES GOD'S WORD SAY? (LIST THE FACTS.)

After reading the passage, make a verse-by-verse list of the outstanding facts. Don't get caught up in the details—just pinpoint the most obvious facts as they appear to you. When you make your list, do not paraphrase the text but use actual words from the passage. Look for the nouns and the verbs.

STEP 3: WHAT DOES GOD'S WORD MEAN? (LEARN THE LESSONS.)

After reading the passage and listing the facts, look for a lesson to learn from each fact. It may help to ask yourself the following questions:

- Who is speaking?
- What is the subject?
- Where is it taking place?
- When did it happen?

• What can I learn from what is taking place or what is being said?

It may also help to ask yourself: What are the people in the passage doing that I should be doing? Is there a command I should obey? A promise I should claim? A warning I should heed? An example I should follow?

Focus on spiritual lessons.

STEP 4: WHAT DOES GOD'S WORD MEAN IN YOUR LIFE? (LISTEN TO HIS VOICE.)

Although this step will be the most meaningful for you, you can't do it effectively until you complete the first three steps. Rephrase the lessons you found in Step 3 and put them in the form of questions you could ask yourself, your spouse, your child, your friend, your neighbor, or your coworker. As you write the questions, listen for God to speak to you through His Word. Don't get hung up on what you don't understand, but look for the general principles and lessons that can be learned. Remember not to rush this process. It may take you several moments of prayerful meditation to discover meaningful lessons from the Scripture you are reading and hear God speaking to you. The object is not to "get through it," but to develop your personal relationship with God in order to grow in faith and learn to hear the whispers of the Holy Spirit.

STEP 5: WHAT WILL YOU DO ABOUT WHAT GOD HAS SAID? (LIVE IN OBEDIENT RESPONSE TO GOD'S WORD.)

Read the assigned Scripture passages prayerfully, objectively, thoughtfully, and attentively as you listen for God to speak. Note that He may not speak to you through every verse, but He will speak. When He does, record the verse number (if applicable), what it is that God seems to be saying to you, and your response to Him. You might like to date these pages as a means not only of keeping a spiritual journal but also of holding yourself accountable to follow through in obedience. (See pages 4–5 for the example that Anne and Rachel-Ruth demonstrate in the video.)

Afterward, it is your turn to try this method on your own using **Deuteronomy 6:5–7**. (See pages 6–7.)

OUR WITNESS

FROM RACHEL-RUTH'S HEART

Anyone familiar with Billy Graham—known to my family as Daddy Bill—knows he shared his faith boldly, without hesitation. Whether witnessing to individuals or preaching in a crowded arena, he did not speak with rehearsed precision. He spoke with passion and conviction because he believed every word he said with every fiber of his being! His deep love for Jesus was always evident in the fire in his piercing blue eyes and the passionate conviction in his familiar voice.

Thousands, even millions, came to faith in Jesus because Daddy Bill's passionate heart for the gospel came through in everything he said and did. Nothing brought him more joy than seeing someone come to Christ! My grandmother, whom we called Tai Tai, told my mom that she and Daddy Bill were once the guests of some friends at a beautiful beach resort. At dinnertime, no one could find Daddy Bill. When Tai Tai went looking for him, she found him behind their building, sharing the gospel with one of the groundskeepers.

My paternal grandfather, whom we simply called Grampa, also shared the gospel with everyone with whom he came in contact, whether a pedestrian on a street corner in New York City, the person riding next to him on the subway, the waiter at the delicatessen he frequented, or one of the hitchhikers he often picked up for the sole purpose of sharing the gospel with them.

One Thanksgiving, he and Gramma were driving down from New York City to spend a week with us. Mom had fixed a beautiful meal to enjoy upon their arrival. We waited and waited. When they finally arrived about eight hours later than expected, we learned Grampa had picked up a hitchhiker, then driven the guy to his destination—six hours out of the way—because Grampa wanted him to know Jesus!

INTRODUCTION FROM ANNE

OUR WITNESS

The requirement of a blood sacrifice seems to have been clearly communicated to Adam and Eve, because their second son, Abel, chose to approach God in that way and God commended him for it. Abel chose to receive the Baton.

There is no record of Abel teaching or preaching. At this early stage of history, there may have been few other people. Instead, he seems to have silently lived a righteous life that was very different from that of his brother, Cain. Abel's witness has stood the test of time, influencing those who have followed, including you and me.

What caused Abel to choose to be a righteous man? I wonder if it was the positive example of his own father within the home. Did Adam's absolute confidence in the reality of God influence his son?

Surely, although he was now separated from Him, Adam never forgot the touch of God's hand, the sound of God's voice, the expressions on God's face, the authority of God's spoken word. His faith in who God is and what God had said would have been unshakable because he knew God firsthand.

Who has impressed you with his or her confidence in God? What a blessing to have parents and grandparents with confident faith. What a blessing to be a parent or grandparent with confident faith!

What will people think of you when you're gone? What will your grandchildren know about you? Perhaps you see shadows of this ancient generation in your own family tree as you consider those who chose faith and those who did not. Wouldn't it be wonderful if, like Abel, you are remembered throughout generations to come as one whose life bore unmistakable witness to your faith in God? The choice is yours.

FROM RACHEL-RUTH'S HEART

REMEMBER MANY OTHER OCCASIONS when Tai Tai, my grandmother, set a limit to my complaints. She would certainly listen and had enormous compassion and wisdom. But she also had the discernment to tell when I was in a whiny mood or just feeling sorry for myself. In those moments, she would tilt her head down in order to muster the deepest voice she could croak out and begin singing an old spiritual:

Nobody knows the trouble I've seen.

Nobody knows but Jesus.

Hearing that deep voice come out of such a tiny woman always put a smile on my face. She used her sense of humor and her ability to commiserate with me to gently remind me to talk to Jesus about whatever the issue was and to quit feeling sorry for myself. I've been guilty of impatiently shutting my kids down when I can tell they are feeling sorry for themselves or are just in a whiny mood. Dropping the hammer certainly stops the pity party, but it may not help their hearts recover as quickly as a sense of humor, compassion, and good old-fashioned distraction. Tai Tai was a master at all three!

It's been said that discouragement is the devil's calling card. He loves to use discouragement to divide relationships, halt effective work, and deflate us to the point that we can hardly function. We have to watch out, knowing the enemy is ultimately behind whatever is discouraging us or our loved ones.

Worshipping the Lord is the best way to fight discouragement. Tai Tai showed me three practical ways to do this: Focus on the blessings in my life, carry a song in my heart, and keep a sense of humor to help remove any traces of discouragement.

INTRODUCTION FROM ANNE

OUR WORSHIP

An authentic witness is inextricably linked to a heart devoted to worship. Abel effectively passed the Baton of Truth to his little brother, Seth, who then passed it to his son, Enosh. It was during Enosh's lifetime that people began to call on the name of the Lord. The subtle implication is that Enosh in some way helped lead people in worship.

What would have motivated Enosh to worship God? I wonder whether it was the negative example of his Uncle Cain, who would still have been alive in Enosh's lifetime.

While Enosh witnessed the negative example of his Uncle Cain, he also was given a front-row seat to the godly example of his own father, Seth. But God has no grandchildren! While Seth could pass on a godly heritage, Enosh could not inherit a personal relationship with God. That had to be his own choice. And living in the midst of an increasingly godless civilization, Enosh made that choice.

When he did, others seem to have followed his lead. I wonder whether his friends and neighbors worshipped individually. Or did they join Enosh in corporate worship? All we are told in Scripture is that it was during the lifetime of Enosh that "men began to call on the name of the Lord."

Public worship must arise out of a private, intimate, authentic relationship with God, or it can become perfunctory and religious. Just a tradition with rituals to keep.

For worship to be contagious, it must also be personal. From the heart. Based on a vibrant faith, rooted in the Truth.

How would you describe your worship? Is it mechanical or heartfelt? And what does heartfelt worship communicate? What role does it play in effectively passing on the Baton of Truth? Let's find out . . .

FROM RACHEL-RUTH'S HEART

NE SUNDAY MY MOM INVITED all my brother's friends over for his sixteenth birthday party. She, of course, made homemade chocolate pound cake and her famous hot fudge sauce to serve with ice cream.

I'm guessing Murdock's eyes (my childhood pet cockatiel) tripled in size as he saw the steaming pot of chocolate and recognized an irresistible opportunity. He spread his wings in flight, his feet stretched out for a perfect landing, right in the pot of hot fudge! Mom and I both muffled our screams, and I grabbed Murdock out of the hot fudge and set him in his cage.

We could hear the boys getting ready to round the corner and enter the room. A handful of feathers stuck out of the hot fudge, looking like stalks in a cornfield. With lightning speed, Mom plucked them out, gave the hot fudge a stir, and, after shooting me a wide-eyed smile, turned to greet the first boy who walked into the kitchen. "Hot fudge?" "Yes, please."

I've thought of that story a million times as I've faced stressful, everyday situations with my girls . . . Scenarios like these are inevitable in family life. Each one gives us a chance to walk out our faith in real time, demonstrating that our priorities are people rather than appearances, and showing the love of God even in stressful times. When we fail to maintain a positive perspective, letting circumstances rather than our unshakable hope determine our attitude, it's time to consider whether we've fallen out of step with God's priorities.

I always remember Mom's reaction to that chocolate catastrophe. She showed extreme patience with me, with Murdock, and with having to serve "birdie" chocolate. She handled it with a sense of humor and a good old-fashioned quick fix.

As I reflect on that memory, I remind myself that I don't need to let stress get the better of me, not when patience and humor can defuse a situation in seconds. Then I determine once again to do my best to be patient and lighthearted, sending up arrow prayers for help when those little stresses come my way.

And I picture Murdock cleaning his feathers as my brother's friends held out their plates for more hot fudge!

INTRODUCTION FROM ANNE

OUR WALK

While we don't know how God motivated Enosh to worship, Enosh did make that choice. And his worship inspired not only his friends and neighbors but also his family to join him. He received the Baton of Truth, expressed it during his lifetime through worship, then passed it to his son, Cainan, who passed it to Mahalalel, who passed it to Jared, who passed it to his son, Enoch, who went one step further in expressing his faith **by walking with God**.

What does it mean to walk with God? It's similar to when I walk with a friend. After we have agreed to a time to meet, then we have two rules as we walk. One rule is that we must walk at the same pace. The second rule is that we must walk in the same direction. Without these two rules, we can't walk together. The same two rules apply to walking with God. We must walk at His pace, which is moment-by-moment obedience to His Word. And we must walk in the same direction, which is surrender to His will. If we don't keep the rules, we can't walk with Him.

Enoch's decision to walk with God seems to have been prompted by the awesome responsibility of parenting a baby: "After he became the father of Methuselah, Enoch walked with God." When Enoch held his firstborn baby in his arms and gazed on the chubby, flushed cheeks, rosebud mouth, curling eyelashes, and little fist wrapped tightly around his finger, he must have been overcome with an intense awareness that it was his responsibility to care for his child's physical, emotional, and spiritual wellbeing. Did he exclaim, "How am I going to raise a godly boy in this decadent culture? I need God!" Whatever his words and emotions in that moment, that's when Enoch began to walk with God.

Whatever your circumstances, *do you have* a deep desire in your heart to draw near to God, to **walk with Him**, to receive His wisdom, strength, and blessing as you seek to ignite faith in the next generation?

Maybe that's one reason you are doing this Bible study. You, too, want to raise your children in the Truth, in knowledge of and reverence for the things of God. If so, walking with God is not an option. You and I must walk with Him moment-bymoment. Day by day.

FROM RACHEL-RUTH'S HEART

On TYPICAL SATURDAY MORNINGS IN THE FALL and Winter, my dad would have me out in the yard doing chores. His archnemesis was the pine tree, and we had a bazillion of them in our yard. I can still smell the pine straw and hear his rake pulling at the pine needles that had laid claim to the ground, covering the grass. He always used the big, heavy rake that seemed to tear out the grass along with the pine needles, but I think he hated pine needles so much that it was worth the sacrifice of a few blades of grass. He'd hand me a lightweight rake and assign me a section of the yard. I would end up with a sore back and some blisters on my hands, but working hard to clear out the pine needles gave me a sense of accomplishment.

Years later, after my dad went to Heaven, I gasped when I first visited his gravesite. Right next to his plot stood a big old pine tree, dropping pine cones and pine needles all over. Even as we all stood there, a pine needle fell and nailed me in the head like a carefully-aimed missile. I just knew it had to be Dad's angel causing us to laugh when we were so incredibly sad.

While hard work seemed to come naturally to my dad, I think it actually was ingrained in him from an early age. My dad was not raised to sit around. He was born in 1937, into a generation that knew war, knew what it was to ration food, knew how to stretch a dollar, and knew that everyone, young and old, had to work hard in order to keep a household running. His was not a generation raised on social media and television but one instilled with grit and determination, a generation with the backbone to work thirty years in one job whether or not they liked it. And if they lost a job, they would immediately find whatever work they could to provide for their families.

We mimic so much of what we see exemplified by our parents. I know my dad's work ethic was a reflection of his own parents, who worked hard their entire lives.

INTRODUCTION FROM ANNE

OUR WORK

Noah received the Baton, and, praise God, not only did he witness, worship, and walk with God; he also worked for God. Have you ever stopped to think about what would have happened had Noah been too busy, too tired, too apathetic, or too self-absorbed to work for God? Without his work, you and I wouldn't be here today! His work for God is of legendary proportions. Even those unfamiliar with the rest of the Bible know about Noah and his work.

As Noah walked with God, he learned that not only judgment but also salvation was on God's mind. The impending judgment would fall on the entire world, but in His mercy, God wanted to offer salvation to those who would accept it. He told Noah to build an ark. And Noah did exactly what God told him to do.

What courage it must have taken for Noah to **do God's work** in front of the whole wicked world. Added to what was surely a barrage of criticism would have been persecution. The New Testament tells us that Noah was a preacher of righteousness. I wonder if he stood in the door of the ark, warning people that judgment was coming. Did he passionately . . . desperately . . . cry out as he offered them salvation from judgment by inviting them into the safety of the ark? Apparently no one listened or took his preaching seriously. And no one—no one!—believed judgment was coming.

As God had revealed what was on His mind, Noah was not only forewarned but also had clear instructions. He knew how to prepare. He knew what **his specific work** was, and he persevered until the work was finished.

So let's get to work! God has provided an ark, a refuge from the storm of His judgment. But the people all around us don't know that judgment is coming, and they therefore don't know that salvation from judgment is even necessary. We need to warn them. If from time to time it occurs to them that they will be held accountable for their willful wickedness, they don't know how to be saved. Our work is to let people know that, yes, judgment is coming, but God offers salvation from His judgment. Just as there was only one door into Noah's ark, there is only one way into salvation from God's judgment: through the cross of Jesus Christ. Our work is to tell people about Jesus, to pass the Baton of Truth to everyone willing to grab hold and run with it.

Ask God to give you an assignment. **A work to do**. Revealing Him in such a way that others are drawn into the ark of salvation by your example. Don't be afraid to let others know you are **working for Jesus**. Accept the Baton of Truth that we are passing to you through this Bible study, and ask God to use it to encourage and motivate you to **work for Him**.

PASS IT ON

BIBLE STUDY Workshop

For the Best experience in facilitating this study, it's important to preview the video for session 1 and complete all the written exercises in this study guide prior to leading your group. Familiarize yourself with the session outline and gather the necessary materials. Pray for the participants by name (if known). Pray Ephesians 1:17–18 for them, that God will open their hearts to His Word, and they will get to know Him better as a result of the Spirit's revelation. INTRODUCTION/OPENING PRAYER

(5 MINUTES)

Take a few moments as this opening session begins to introduce yourself to anyone in the group you do not know and give your contact information. If it can be done quickly, ask the participants to introduce themselves. It may be helpful in a larger group to provide nametags. To save time, you can have the nametags pre-printed with their names on one side, and your name and contact information on the other side. Ensure the participants have a copy of the study guide. Pray that God would use this session to help everyone present to become more effective students and doers of His Word.

EXPLANATION OF BIBLE STUDY SESSIONS (5 MINUTES)

Explain that this first session in *Jesus Followers* is unique, as Anne will describe a method for studying the Bible that they will use during their personal quiet time throughout the study. During this opening session, which will be approximately 90 minutes in length, the group members will watch the video and complete the work found on pages 4–7.

VIDEO TEACHING AND GROUP WORK (70 MINUTES)


Show the video, following the instructions given by Anne during the session. Note that you will be stopping the video periodically for the participants to complete each of the steps.
